Lament and Hope 18th October, 10:00 am - 4:00 pm at Rotherham Minster

Eco Church event with creative arts and music to honour the Season of Creation.

A space to lament and reflect on the damage we've done to creation, to explore hope and how we can make a difference. 'Stations of Lament' art exhibition created by the late Revd Louise Carr. Meet other Eco Churches and chat with our Diocesan Environment Team. Healing and Wholeness space; Eco craft activity for all ages. Service with the Steel City Choristers and the choristers of Rotherham Minster. Free to attend. No need to book in advance and you can attend for as little or as much of the day as you like. Tea and coffee will be served throughout the day.

Eco tip – Saving Water - swap to a shower instead of a bath and challenge yourself to a 4 minute time limit! Scrape your dishes instead of rinsing with water. Only start a cycle in your washing machine or dishwasher when you have a full load and select the eco setting, if you have one. Check your taps regularly for signs or sounds of leas. A tap dripping at a rate of 1 drip per second loses over 12,000 litres per year! (Waterwise UK)

Water Saving

Water is a precious resource so staying with the water saving theme, Yorkshire Water are working with a company called Aqualogic who are undertaking FREE water saving home visits which could help save up to £75 per year on your water and energy bills.

Sign up online at www.fit2save.net or ring Aqualogic on 0332 400266 to book a convenient time for an engineer's visit. The engineer will carry out a survey of your water use and explain how basic every day changes could help you save water, energy and money on your bills.

The engineer will recommend the right FREE Fit2Save products for you based on the survey and they'll be fitted on the day. This will probably all take less than an hour!
