Here is something to pass the time at home as we can't meet in church at the moment – a story and some activities.

Story

Do you remember how we had a story a little while ago about Jacob and how he ran away from home after he had cheated his brother Esau and had a dream about the angels coming and going on a sort of stairway or ladder to heaven?

Well, after that Jacob came to the land of his mother's people and he fell in love with the younger daughter of the family, Rachel. He wanted to marry her and his uncle said he could, if he worked for him for seven years. Jacob agreed, and at the wedding his bride was brought to him covered in a long veil. After the marriage he lifted the veil – and found that his uncle had cheated him. The bride was Rachel's older sister, Leah. 'If you want Rachel,' said his crafty uncle, Laban, 'you will have to work for me for another seven years.' Jacob was trapped. So he did work another seven years for Laban. And he married Rachel too – men were allowed to marry more than one wife in those days.

But then Jacob got away. He wasn't going to stay with his cheating uncle any more. He would go home to his brother, even though he was still afraid of what Esau might do.
