We would also like to make some paper angels to give away to everyone coming to our carol service and Christingle. We estimate that we'll need 300+ in total, so if you can help with this that would be wonderful (and we'll also be making these on the craft afternoon too). You will need some beads and bows and ribbon and glue, so if you've only got some paper, you can still help by folding that up for us as per the pattern, and we can use the folded paper, add the other bits to it and finish them off to make more Angels.
